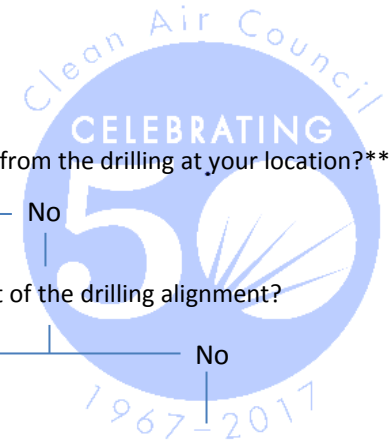


Water Supply Identification and Testing & Notification of Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD)

Based on the August 9, 2017 Settlement reached on Mariner East 2 Horizontal Directional Drilling



Had drilling started at your location as of 7/19/17?*

Per Section 6.1 of the Water Supply Plan***, you will be provided with pre and post construction testing if you request it. You will not, however, be given notice of the start (or restart) of drilling.

10 days prior to the start (or restart) of drilling, all landowners with parcels within 450 feet of HDD alignment will be identified and sent a notification letter from Sunoco asking about whether there is a private water supply within 450 feet of the HDD alignment.

You will receive notice 72 hours prior to the start of drilling. If you have a water supply within 150 feet of the HDD alignment, it should have already been identified by Sunoco. Let them know if they missed it and request the testing you are entitled to. Also let the Department of Environmental Protection know as Sunoco's failure to contact you about the location of your water supply may be a permit violation.

Is your land within 450 feet of the HDD alignment?

Per Section 6.1 of the Water Supply Plan***, you will be provided with pre and post construction testing if you request it.

All landowners with a private water supply within 450 feet of the HDD alignment will be offered water testing. Sunoco will complete that testing prior to commencing drilling at that site as long as the request is made within 10 days of the date on the mailed notice. Testing will also be provided during and after drilling if requested. You also may be entitled to comment on certain drill site evaluations.

Within 30 days of drilling restarting at your site, Sunoco will provide you with notice that you can have your water supply tested. If you opt for testing, that testing is to happen within 10 days of your request.

Per Section 6.1 of the Water Supply Plan ***, you will be provided with pre and post construction testing if you request it. You will not, however, be given notice of the start (or restart) of drilling.

For purposes of this chart, those are the sites where drilling has started. There are also sixteen sites for which the ban was lifted prior to settlement. They can be found by comparing Exhibit 1 to Sunoco's Emergency Motion filed 7/27/17 <http://ehb.courtapps.com/efile/documentViewer.php?documentID=38347> to Court's order of 8/3/17 <http://ehb.courtapps.com/efile/documentViewer.php?documentID=38508>. Those 16 sites are not addressed here. If you have a private water supply within 150 of one of those 16 sites, Sunoco should have already identified the water supply and offered you water testing. If that did not happen, you should contact Sunoco to report your well location and request testing. You should also notify the Department of Environmental Protection as Sunoco's failure to contact you about the location of your water supply may be a permit violation.
